- ▣ Saving as a PDF in Chrome is almost identical to how you would save as a PDF on an Apple Mac

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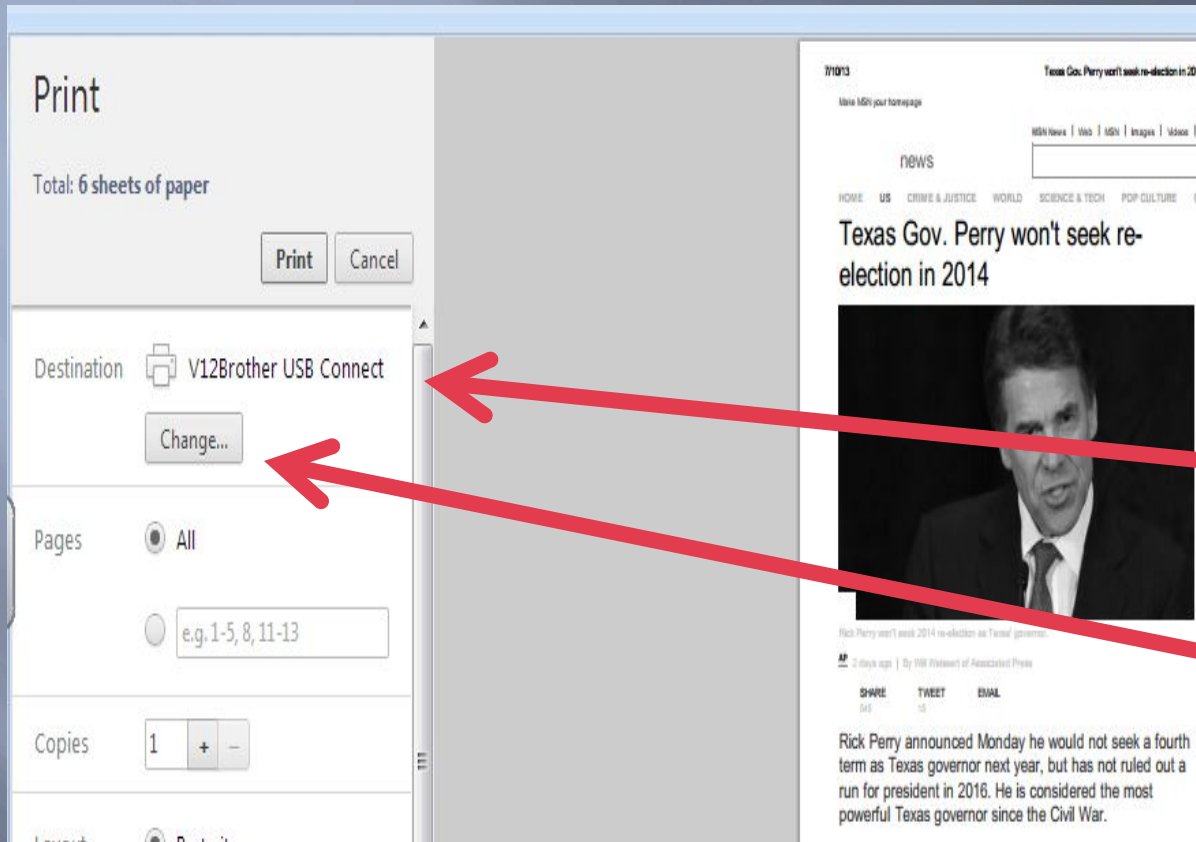

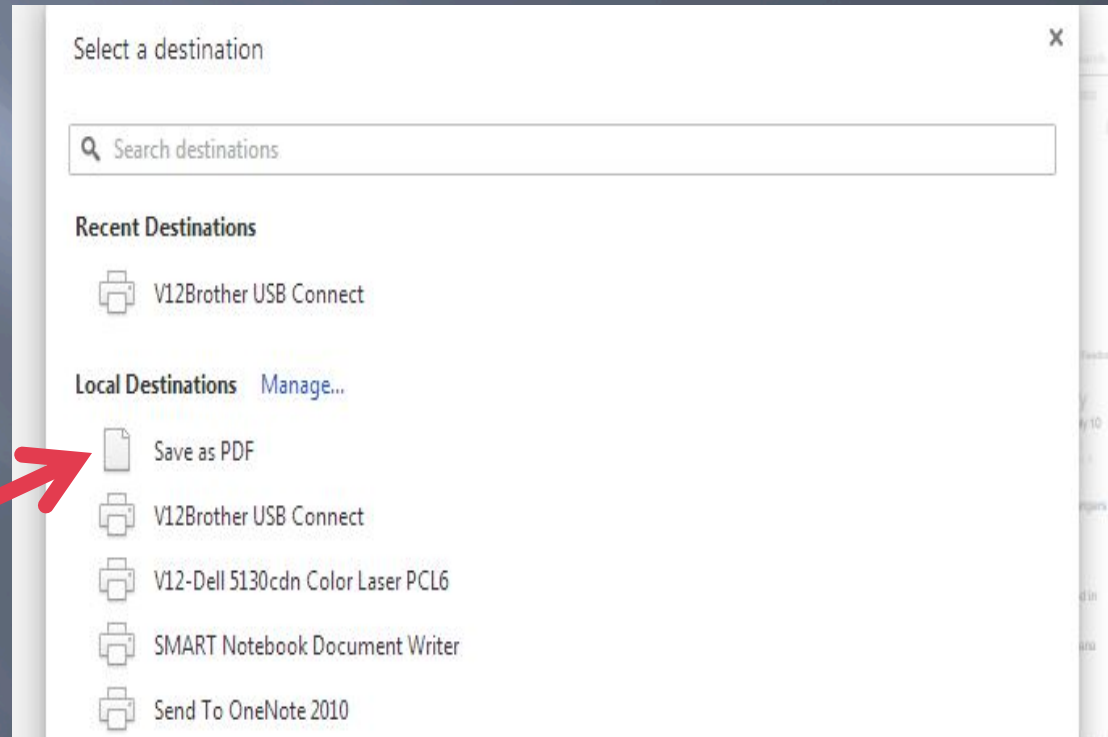
Saving as a PDF in Chrome



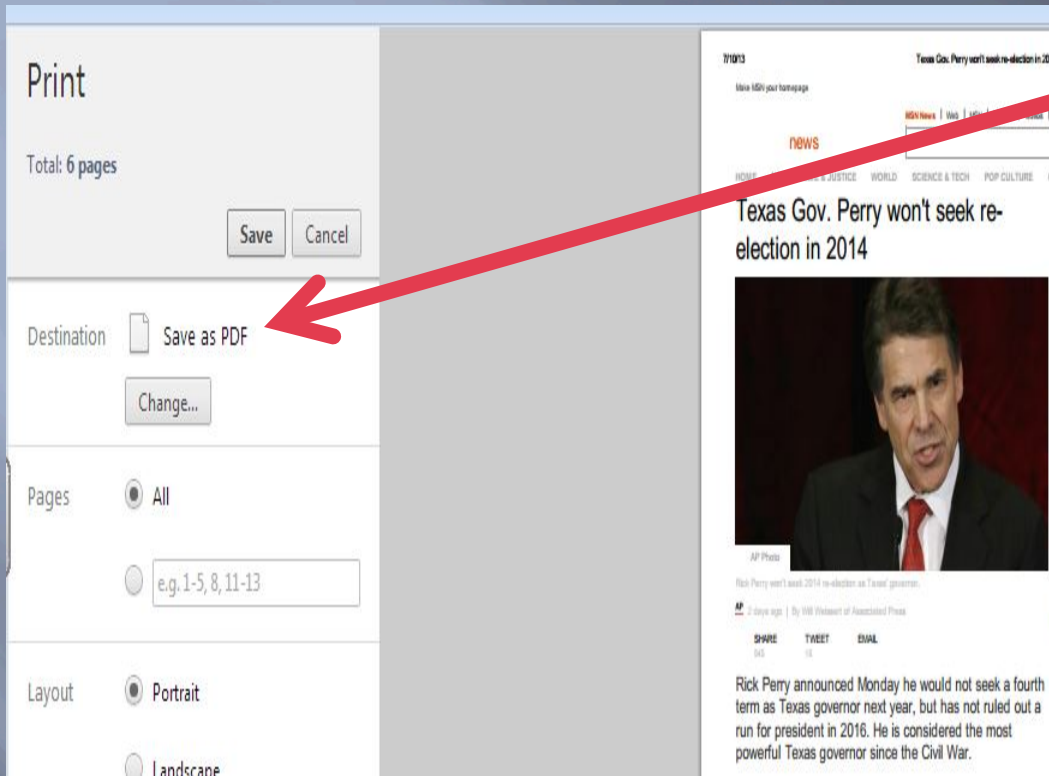
- ❑ In Chrome, Ctrl-P will bring up the print menu
- ❑ Notice the destination
- ❑ Hit the “CHANGE ...” button

Saving as a PDF in Chrome

- ▣ The Change button will bring up a menu that looks like this
- ▣ Click the “Save as PDF” option



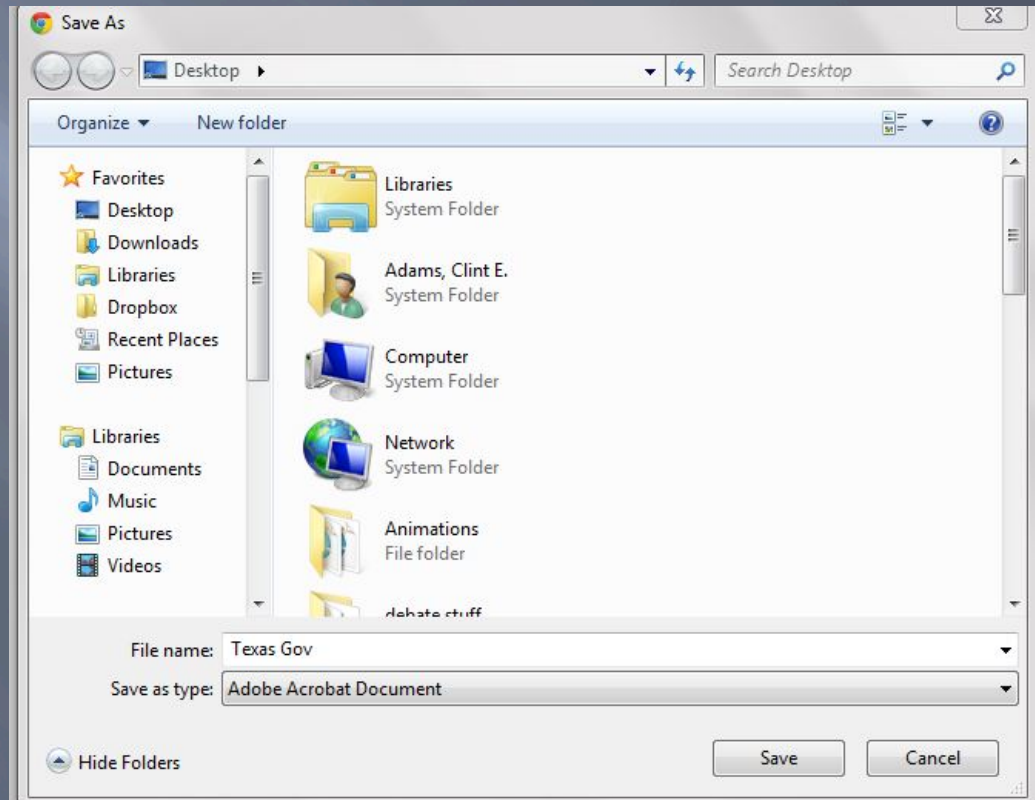
Saving as a PDF in Chrome



- Now the print command screen will have changed

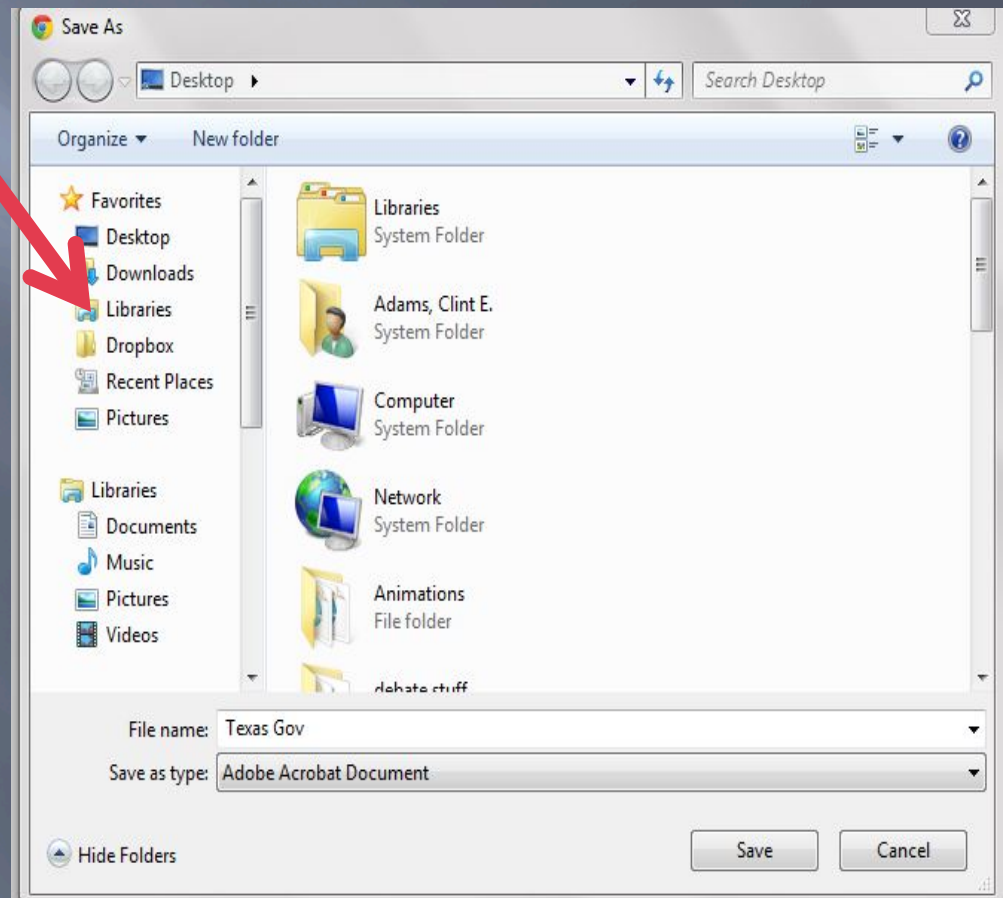
Saving as a PDF in Chrome

Hitting Save will bring up the standard “Save As” screen

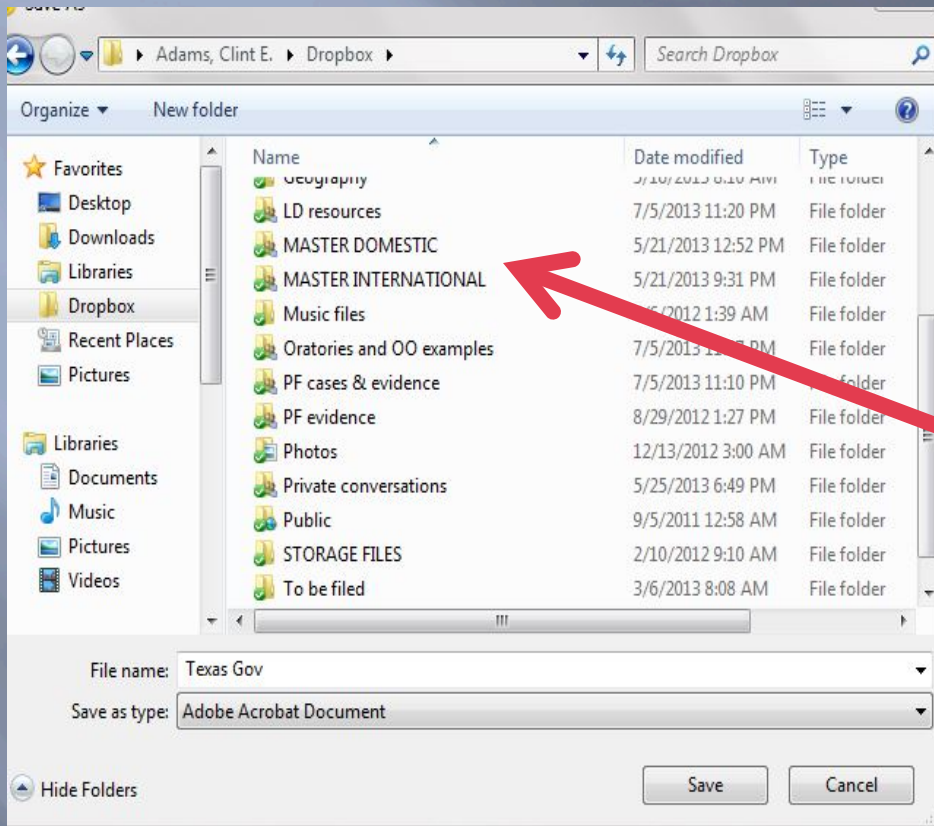


Saving as a PDF in Chrome

- ❑ Notice the “Dropbox” destination on the left
- ❑ Click on it to set your destination

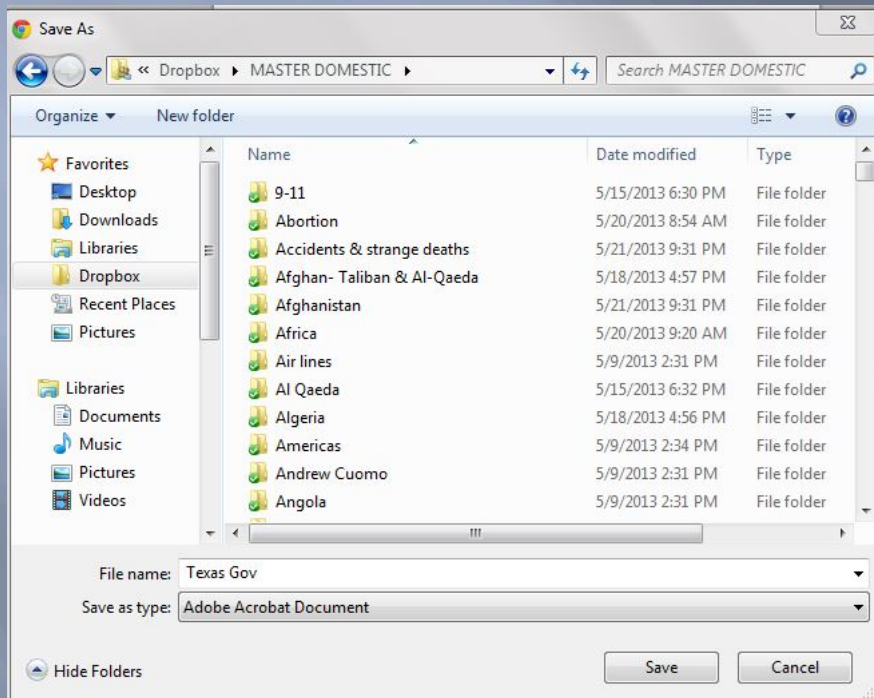


Saving as a PDF in Chrome



- ❑ Clicking on it will bring up your dropbox folders
- ❑ We file in Master Domestic and Master International

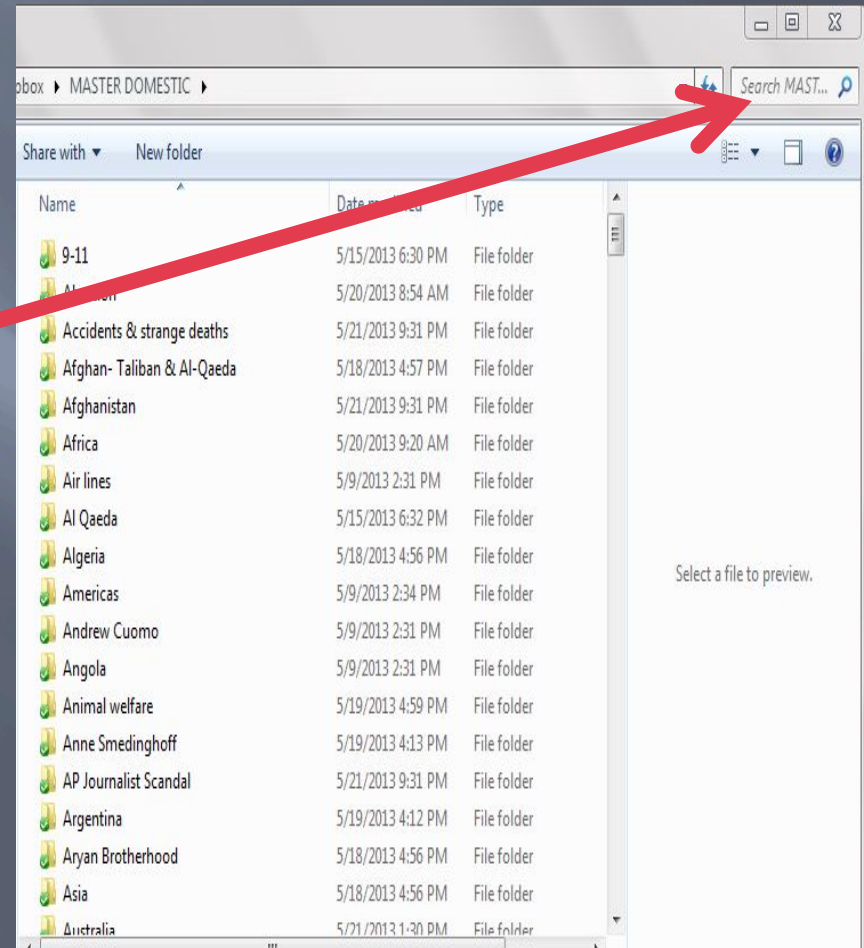
Saving as a PDF in Chrome



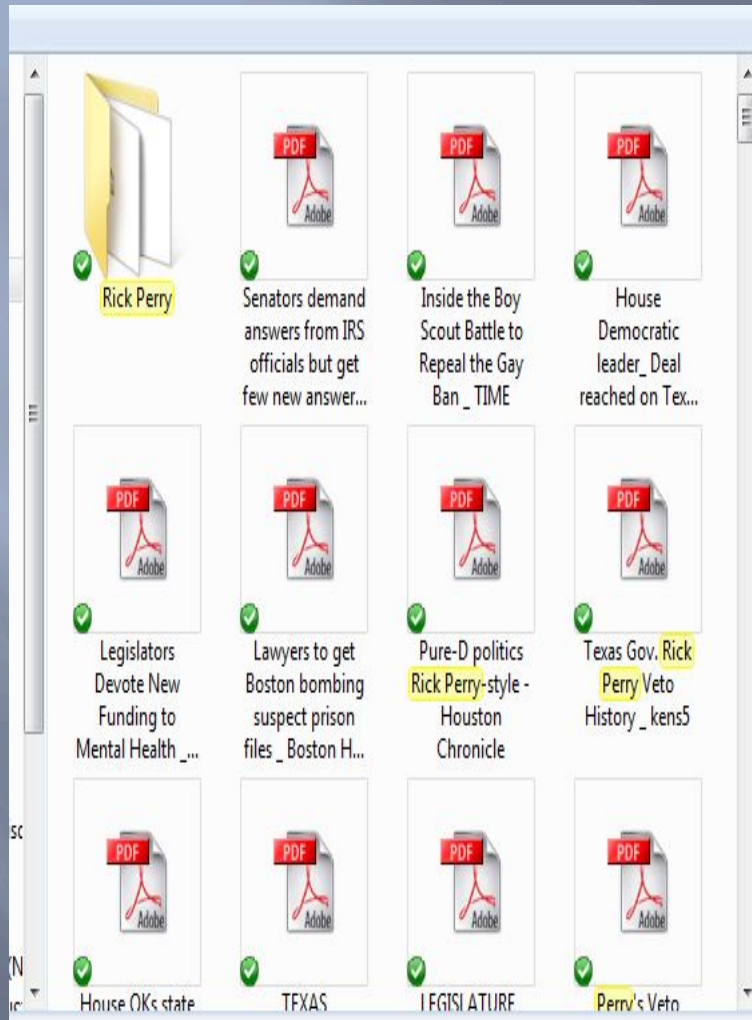
- ▣ We still file in individual folders in the master folders
- ▣ The night before the tournament, we download the files to a portable hard drive and drop it on the student computers.

Finding your Files

- ▣ Finding your files is the easiest part
- ▣ When you open the file folder you will notice the “Search” box



Finding your Files



- For example, if you put “Rick Perry” in your search; your results will show all of the articles that Rick Perry is mentioned in
- The more specific the search, the better the results

Spotlight search

- ▣ This is advantageous because so many articles could be filed in numerous places.
- ▣ This keeps you from having to file an article more than one.
- ▣ The downside is that it brings up so much information, it sometimes becomes a time issue.

Keeping your files

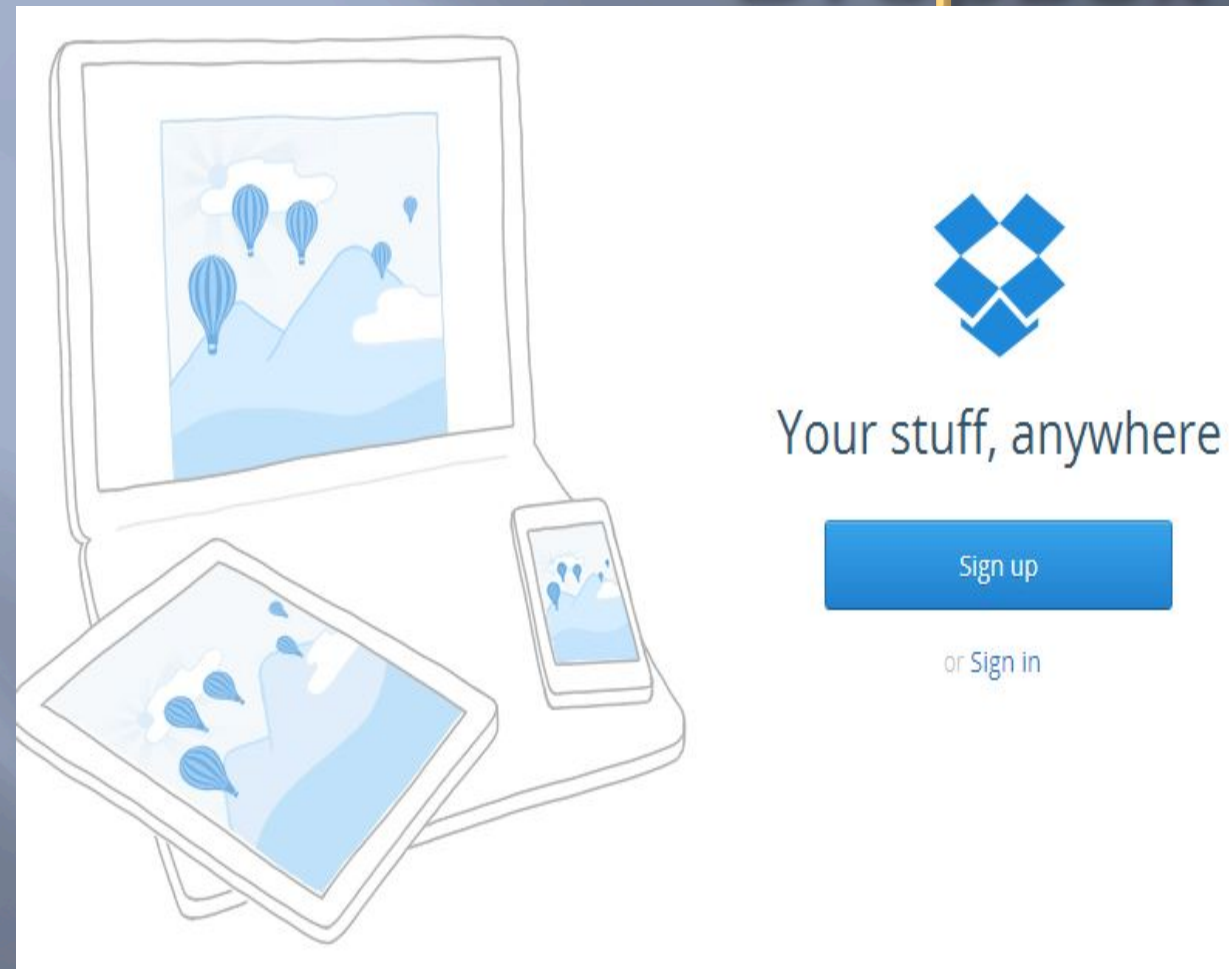
- ▣ You will need to store your files on a portable device such as a flash drive or portable hard drive.
- ▣ But there are some options to keep your files “off-site”

Offsite File Hosting

- ▣ The advantages of having an offsite file hosting service:
 - Students can drop files from home or on the road
 - Anywhere you have internet access, you will have your files.
 - Most are easy to transfer to a flash drive for draw

DropBox

- ▣ We use this service as it has been the easiest for us to manipulate. We purchase one large drop box subscription (\$99 year)





Joining the shared folder

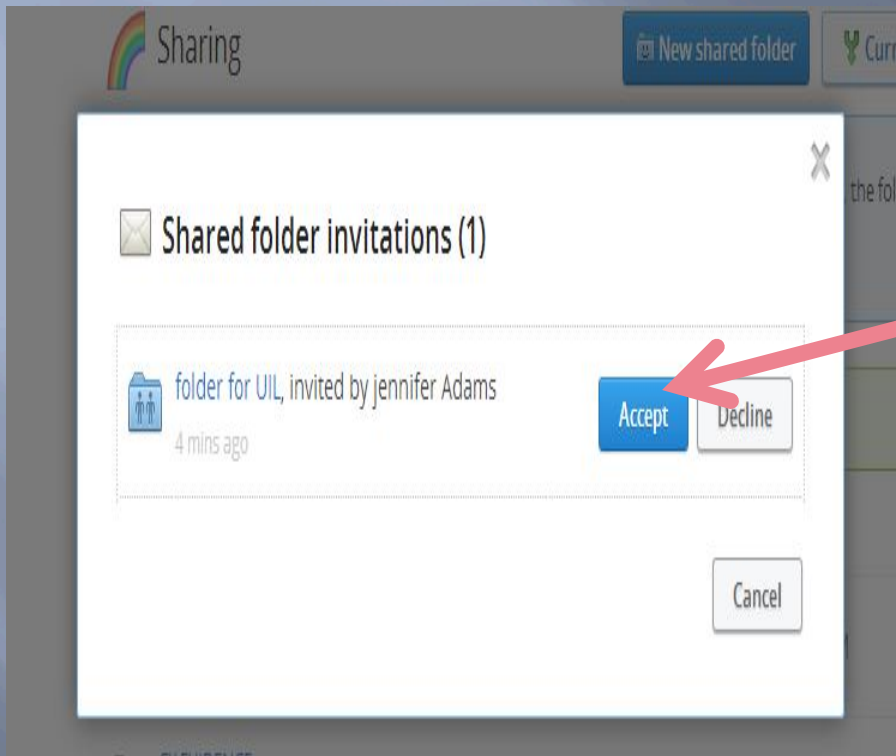

Accept to join



Clicking 'Accept' is the final step to joining a shared folder.

Pitfalls

- ❑ In a shared folder if someone deletes files, they are deleted from ALL computers... make sure you keep a back up somewhere safe.
- ❑ Sometimes the files become very large and may need to be separated for manageability. We have used a Master A-J, K-S, T-Z format, or regions (Africa, Latin America...)
- ❑ Smaller files will aid in transferring to flash-drives.

PROS

- ❑ No tubs
- ❑ No paper costs

- ❑ Ease of Searching
- ❑ Multiple students can access the same article
- ❑ You can update on the road
- ❑ No lost or misfiled folders
